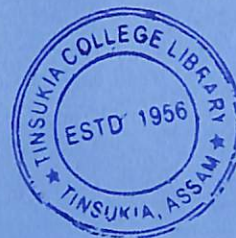
Higher education is very important for the creation of skilled human resource in a developing country like India and it has experienced phenomenal expansion since independence. Higher Education provides opportunities to the people to reflect on the critical, social, cultural, moral, economic and spiritual issues facing humanity. Education is an essential tool for achieving sustainability. The Education Commission 1964-66 described the role of education in social and economic transformation through a statement – The density of a nation is shaped in its class rooms. Education creates human capital which is the core of economic progress and assumes that the externalities generated by human capital are the source of self sustaining economic process.

The role of higher education in the emerging scenario of knowledge economy is very crucial for any country in general and India in particular. India's higher education system is the world's third largest in terms of students, next to China and the United States. Unlike China, however, India has the advantage of English being the primary language of higher education and research.

As India strives to compete in a globalised economy in areas that require highly trained professionals, the quality of higher education becomes increasingly important. The present system of higher education in India does not necessarily serve the purpose for which it has been started. Generally, education itself has become so profitable a business that quality is lost in the increase of quantity of professional institutions, thereby increasing unemployment of graduates without quick relief to mitigate their sufferings in the job market of the country.

India can no longer continue with the model of general education as it has been persisting in for the large bulk of the student population. Rather, it requires a major investment to make human resource productive by coupling the older general disciplines of humanities, social sciences, natural sciences and commerce to their applications in the new economy and having adequate field based experience to enhance knowledge with skills and develop appropriate attitudes. Keeping this crucial aspect of education in mind, steps have been initiated in our college to introduce various innovative courses like 'Beautician and Wellness Programme,' 'Spoken English Pre Basic Course,' 'Agriculture Training,' 'Tourism Development Course' from the Academic Session 2017-2018 to develop various skills of the learners which in turn will brighten their employability prospects. The process of education is not merely digesting books; it is also about doing several co-curricular and extra-curricular activities that give a broader meaning to life in general and education in particular. We believe that opportunities for such holistic developments will carry forward the Higher Education scenario in India.

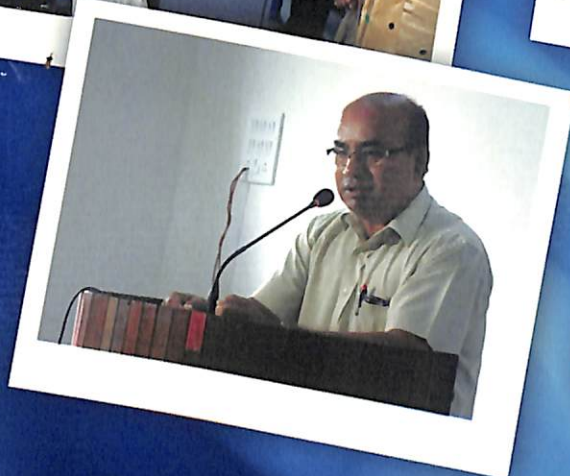
